Also, a bio-processing option is available in the Industrial Engineering Technology AAS program. The biotechnology program prepares graduates for employment as research assistants to biologists or chemists, laboratory technicians, quality controller, quality assurance technicians with the molecular biology skills necessary in the bioprocessing and biomanufacturing industries. Entry level salaries for graduates range from \$25,000 to 30,000, and can reach \$50,000 in five years.
